### RULES

#### BOYS' AND GIRLS' NATIONAL SCHOOLS,

CHRIST CHURCH, HAMPSTEAD.

1. Children shall be admitted from the age of seven years and upwards.
2. Application for admission may be made at the School by one of the parents, or a friend having the care of the children; who, if the child is admitted, shall receive a copy of the rules. Such admission will be subject to the approval of the Committee at their monthly meeting.
3. No children shall be admitted unless they have been vaccinated, nor allowed to attend if there be any infectious complaint in the house in which they live.
4. Two pence weekly shall be paid in advance every Monday morning for each child. In the case of two or more children of the same family attending the same school, the weekly payments will be two pence for the first, and one penny each for the rest.
5. School hours: morning, nine to twelve; afternoon, two to half-past four.—Saturday is a holiday.
6. Any child who is absent from School without leave, or who shall not attend regularly at the hours prescribed, shall be liable to be suspended; and unless the friends of the child attend the School to explain the cause of absence, shall be liable to dismissal.

Well done on identifying rights which weren't really given back in 1856.

#### Note to Rule 4.

Until the first Monday in April, 1856, one penny only will be charged for the first child as well as for the rest.

*There is a Clothing Club in connexion with each School.*

The rules set out in 1856 above either **support** or go **against** UNICEF's rights for children. Using UNICEF's list of rights, write down which article they are related to and why/why not do they support the right.

1. Article 31 = is against rule one. Since at school you get to join in activities and play.
2. Article 2 is against rule three because they don't want ill people.
3. Article 28 is for rule five since it says children should have an education.
4. Article 31 is against rule five since it says children should relax.
5. Article 37 is against rule six since it says children shouldn't be harshly treated.
