Cybersyn: a Vision of Holistic Governance


- The creation and application of Cybersyn to the Chilean economy in the early 1970s was indeed an instance of visionary thinking. More than the success or failure of its implementation it was its creativity and vision what was left for the future (see Espejo R. - Beyond its technological implementation Cybersyn was a proposal for holistic governance; Beer's Viable System Model was a visionary anticipation of the shortcomings of our reductionist and fragmented management.



Communications and Transparency

A cyber-systemic challenge is making citizens and politicians increasingly aware of the need of holistic governance to improve the prevailing reductionist approaches.

Beer's Viable System Model

Towards...

- Holistic governance requires the co-production of values between the people (citizens) and policy-makers to make visible their guidance and concerns and...
- Transparency of communications between citizens and policy-makers is far more than making information available: it is building up effective organisational systems.
- These are points emerging from the vision of Beer's Cybersyn.
