Further Information about the Programme.

Professor I. Gass of the Open University introduces two investigators of material brought back by the Apollo missions.

They discuss new data supplied by the x-ray spectrometer and gamma ray spectrometer on the most recent missions.

The structures of the maria on the Moon's surface and the rocks of which they consist are dealt with in some detail. Speculation on the origins of the maria is included.

The broadcast ends with details of what we now know about the Moon, its structure and rocks, which according to Professor O'Hara is possibly ten or even a hundred times more than we know about any comparable group of terrestrial material - a truly remarkable spin-off from space research.
