SYNOPSIS

This programme is the penultimate for D102 and is the third in the series of four programmes (the other being TV4, TV18 and TV32) in which Bernard Williams, Professor and Provost of Kings College, Cambridge discusses philosophical issues that arise during D102.

Here, he debates with Stuart Hall, OU Professor of Sociology, the competing individualist (pluralist) and Marxist models of politics and shows how a debate between them can modify them and, despite the remaining fundamental differences between them, cause them each to recognise that its rival has at least some contribution to make to the understanding of politics and society.
