Northern Ireland's first Graduation Ceremony is now arranged for next Spring. The event was originally planned for June 8th in Belfast's King's Hall, but was cancelled because of difficulties caused by the recent situation in the province. Instead the 120 graduates who were due to attend will be joined by the 1975 group of graduates when they are presented to the Chancellor next Spring. Altogether about 280 graduates should be at the Ceremony. Details of the event will be sent out later.

The new West Midlands Regional office has been opened by Sir Peter Venables who has just retired as the University's first Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council. Sir Peter has strong connections with the area because he was formerly Vice-Chancellor of Aston University.

He played a leading role in the creation of the University when he was appointed Chairman of the Planning Committee set up in 1967 to work out a comprehensive plan.

His successor as Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council - which is the University's governing body - is the Deputy Chairman, Sir Frederick Warner, a distinguished chemical engineer.

The three distinguished Honorary graduates, the Prime Minister, Dr. Ralph Dahrendorf and Lord Feather, struck a note of relaxed informality by walking to the hall from the reception at the nearby Midland hotel wearing their blue and gold robes. The B.A. graduands almost all wore academic robes at this Ceremony. After the Chancellor had formally opened the Congregation Dr. James Barber presented the first Honorary graduand, Dr. Dahrendorf, who is Director Designate of the L.S.E., and referred first of all to his book, "Homo-Sociologicus".
