James Barber:

Hello and welcome to Open Forum. This is in fact the first of all the Open University television programmes, and the Vice Chancellor, Dr Walter Perry, had hoped to be with us today. Unfortunately he's unwell and so hasn't been able to come. But here in the studio with me is the University Secretary, Mr. Christodoulou, and he's going to speak to you first. Chris.
