What is scholarship (1)?

Ernest Boyer (1990) Scholarship reconsidered: Priorities of the professoriate

Creation of knowledge through:

- The scholarship of discovery original research that advances knowledge
- The scholarship of integration bringing together knowledge from different disciplines, places and times
- The scholarship of engagement applying knowledge to real life problems in a systematic way
- The scholarship of teaching and learning research into teaching and learning, including dissemination of the findings



What is scholarship (2)?

- Institutional Scholarship investigation of questions of interest to the OU
- 2. Scholarship of Teaching investigation of one's own or others' teaching, assessment and learning design.
- 3. Scholarship for Teaching activities contributing to the development of learning materials, modules and curricula.
- 4. Scholarship in support of Professional Practice (c.f Boyer's scholarship of engagement).
- 5. Discipline Based Scholarship (c.f Boyer's scholarships of discovery and integration)

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What is scholarship (4)?

A broad term that can mean specific things in some contexts Therefore scholarship means whatever the speaker/writer means at that particular moment.

Two implications:

- 1.Be alert to possible misunderstandings when using the term
- 2.Don't get phased by "scholarship". You are a scholar and you do scholarship.




What's missing? Scholarship of personal practice
