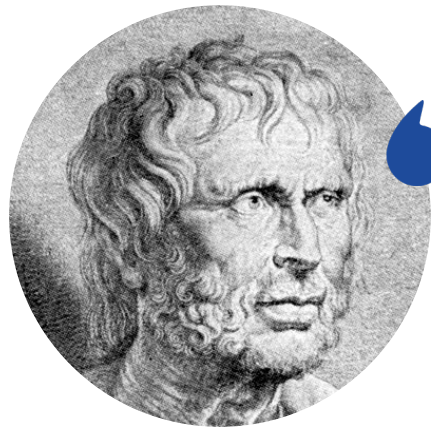

# What is Emotion?

Our beliefs determine how we measure accuracy

**Basic**

**“discrete, have a fixed set of neural and bodily expressed components, and a fixed feeling or motivational component”  
(Tracy & Randles, 2011)**

**Pragmatic  
Action**

**“transformations in a physical or social space to advance toward a certain goal state”  
(Wilutzky, 2015)**

**Social  
Reality**

**“To create emotions (...), there must be a group of people who agree that certain instances (...) serve particular functions”  
(Barrett, 2012)**

## Interpret Social Reality

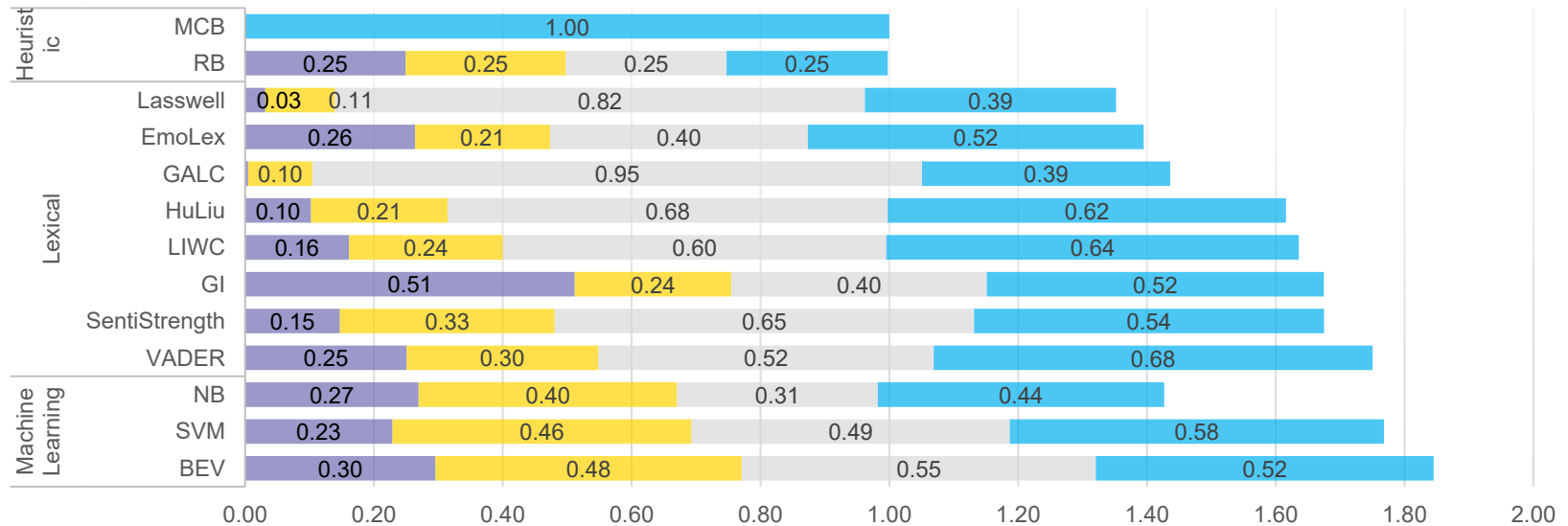
- Normative Paradigm
