

“discrete, have a fixed set of neural and bodily expressed components, and a fixed feeling or motivational component”

(Tracy & Randles, 2011)

“transformations in a physical or social space to advance toward a certain goal state”

(Wilutzky, 2015)

“To create emotions (...), there must be a group of people who agree that certain instances (...) serve particular functions”

Interpret Social Reality


