



Three Examples of Online Student Pathways





Setting-Up and **Accessing Moodle**

Step 1:

 The administrator sets up Moodle page to house the course

Step 2:

Course codes are generated and the academic team gains access to the Moodle page for their course

Course Mapping & **Content Development**

- Step 1:

 Set up team resource area for collaboration (MS Teams)

- Step 2:

 Development (30hrs per 10 credits) can include support from various groups i.e., LISU/ MPU

Phase One:

Course Interest & UofG

Approval

Step 1: Course proposed by external partner (FL) or internally by LTC or College/Scool lead

Step 2:

Market analysis for course viability and pricing

Step 3:

Course overview session(s) between the LISU and academic Team, discusses CMF and PIP alignment

Step 4:

Formal proposal submitted via the **UofG** course approval process (PIP) before the deadline

-Step 5

Post-PIP-approval meeting between LISU and academic team to discuss the timeline of course development and expectations

Phase Two:

Course Shells & **Overview of Platforms**

Step 1:

LISU submits course proposal form to FL for approval

Step 2:

Moodle page to house UofG resources and graded assessments for the course

Step 3:

Academic team gains access to FL and Moodle pages for their course

Step 4:

Familiarising academic team with the FL platform, which includes training and sharing resources from the LISU

Step 5:

LISU builds skelton structures for the course within FL and Moodle

Phase Three:

Course Mapping & Content Development

Set up team resource area for collaboration (MS Teams)

Step 2:

Off platform Miro mapping of weekly structure using UCL Connected Curriculum

Step 3:

Academic team begins adding content to FL platform

Step 4:

meetings between the academic team and LISU to ensure alignmen between the platform and content

Step 5:

Finalise plans for any type of partnerships, finances, and marketing of the course

Phase Four:

Managing Content & **Finalising Course**

-Step 1:

Start to plan communication strategy for the course and launch activity about 12 weeks out

Step 2:

Academic team finishes adding content to the FL platform and completes building the Moodle course page

Step 3:

Course administrator ensures registration and enrollment processes are in places such as accurate course codes, registration emails and form, and enrollment

Step 4:

Ensure course landing page on FL is complete and ready to be published

Step 5:

LISU reviews content on both FL and Moodle course pages
