



The Iraqi Cultural Heritage





- Mosul is one of the largest cities in Iraq. It has a rich cultural heritage that includes diverse religions and ethnicities.
- This diversity can be also seen in most of the Iraqi cities.
- Despite a long historical tradition of pluralism and cohesion, the effects of war and the recent ISIS insurgency have led to increasing fragmentation and the social fabric. (United Nation Iraq, 2017).

- Reconstructing confidence between diversity of ethnicities and cultures.

- Videos (lecture, documentary)
- Podcast
- Massive Online Open Course (MOOCs)





Why we did not use Wikis?



- Wikis seek to involve the typical visitors in an **ongoing process of collaboration** that constantly changes the website landscape.
- The wiki structure emerges according to the needs of both users and audience (e.g. debate and interaction).
- Therefore, wiki is not the best way to decrease social division.





Using Wikis for Learning and Collaboration

The project's plan



- The project, seeks to use MOOCs to deepen appreciation for cultural heritage and develop social-cohesion in a post-conflict environment.
- Several academics engaged in the training programme and capacity building around the creation of MOOCs.
- Academics should engage with the community of learners outside of the formal university.
- These academics will develop both an understanding of cultural heritage and improve social cohesion through MOOCs.

Training sessions



- Planned: two training sessions should be held in UK HEIs.
 - OER in general
 - Cultural heritage
- The plan changed as result of Covid 19

- Implemented: Several online workshops held in Iraq.
 - OER
 - Cultural heritage



Training sessions

- Other benefits:
 - Increasing participants from 10 to more than 40.
 - Connecting with other partners.
 - Lecturers from diverse groups that suffered from wars.

 The first paper studies changes in academic attitudes to and competencies in MOOCs that occur through a one-year training programme (three times of interviews).

Publications' plan



The second paper studies the feedback collected from learners (the changes in knowledge and attitudes).
