Module description

How does psychological enquiry help us to understand human development? This module is organised in four parts: *Psychological development and early childhood* introduces ways of thinking about and understanding it from a psychological point of view; *Children's personal, social and emotional development* follows the individual's development in a social context; *Cognitive and language development in children* explores the development of cognitive and linguistic understanding and the developing child as an active agent. The final part, *Developmental psychology in action*, presents areas in which developmental psychology plays a part in education, the legal system, health and autism with children of all ages.
