
 Environmental management 2 T319

Presentation pattern October to June

Module description

This module focuses on innovations in and the facilitation of environmental management concepts and practice. Students will examine systems theories in detail and have the opportunity to investigate complex situations at domestic, organisational and community levels. Using London Heathrow Airport as a case study, they will gain different perspectives of environmental management situations, the views of stakeholders, how these are represented and the impact of these views for further action and innovation. The module is designed to follow and build on the ideas, tools and their uses introduced in T219 *Environmental management 1*.

Person specification
