Volunteers Week 1 - 7 June

Volunteers Week takes place 1-7 June every year. This week is an annual celebration of the contribution millions of people make across the UK through volunteering in their communities. On

Here are some new courses on OpenLearn:

<u>Supporting older people with learning</u> <u>disabilities and their families</u>



What does excellent care and support for older people with learning disabilities and behaviour that

challenges others look like? How do you know when you see it? How can it be replicated across different settings? And who needs to be involved in delivering it?

This course is for anyone working with older people with learning disabilities, including those whose behaviour may challenge others. It is for registered professionals and non-registered health and social care workers.



A short introduction to the English language

This course looks at the role language plays in our lives, with a particular focus on the English language. It will examine the history and the future of the

language, from the Anglo-Saxons and Shakespeare to social media communication and stand-up comedy.

Leadership for inclusion: what can you do?

This course will help to develop your understanding of how to promote and support learning for all, within classrooms with a diverse student and staff



population. It will encourage you to embrace your own capacity to lead at any level of an organisation.



Leadership for inclusion: thinking it through

This course will help you to think about your professional educational situation and the ways in which you can develop your practices alongside

others. It will provide you with a better understanding of competing values within the school system and how to identify and build upon opportunities to lead and collaborate in this context. Support for Disabled Students

You may be working with learners who are considering moving on to taught programs with the Open University who have a disability and would like to know more about the support on offer. The key information for enquirers can be found <u>here</u>.



In this newsletter, I wanted to highlight our approach to ensuring the right support is in place.

We work with our students to develop relevant support plans.

When students tell us they need support to ensure teaching and learning is as accessible as possible, we will find out as much as we can about support needs in relation to the following to ensure any adjustments that are needed are made, any external support such as Disabled Student Allowance is explored, and crucially so that tutors are aware of how they can best support each student as an individual:

- Communication needs
- How best to facilitate access to tutorials (including before, during and after tutorials)
- How tutors can best support throughout the module
- Approaches to workload planning and management
- How best to deliver feedback on assessments
- Adjustments for exams*

We take a person-centred approach to exploring student needs and ensuring that what we put in place provides a 'level playing field' in relation to studies. This information is written up as a needs profile which is visible to the student and their tutor, and can be changed at any time as students needs change across their study journey.
