## **COP and Open Conversations**

In our October update, Dr Victoria Hands, Sustainability Director, put a call out for articles discussing COP27 or the link between climate and nature, a key theme of COP27 and the sister COP on Biodiversity underway this week. My thanks again to all those who sent in contributions. We have now begun publishing some of these articles on The Open University's Sustainability website.

There is also still time to <u>register for Open Conversations</u>, which is happening 1 – 2:30pm this afternoon (Tuesday 13 December). Designed to promote and enable open conversation between panel members and the audience, these events will prompt dynamic discussion and a solutions-focussed approach whilst asking the questions that are often avoided on a range of sustainability issues. This Open Conversation event will:

- · look back on COP26 and COP27
- consider the lower-profile sister COP on Biodiversity
- look to the future COP28 to be hosted by the United Arab Emirates

# We will also ask:

- what if it is still possible to keep 1.5°C alive? Our panel discusses what this
  means.
- what if we all committed to take action now to contribute to reduced carbon emissions and protecting nature? Our panel describe what this might look like.
- what if organisations all committed to transformative action now?

The event will be a 90-minute interactive panel discussion held online (MS Teams) and featuring Professor of Climate Change and Energy, Stephen Peake; three of our OU

COP26 delegation, Dr Leslie Mabon, Dr Clive Mitchell, and Janice Ansine; and PhD student Meng-Chin Tsai. Dr Victoria Hands will host the event.

## **Knowledge Transfer Vouchers (KTV)**

RES (Research Enterprise and Scholarship) is supporting the OU's endeavours towards sustainability through allocating HEIF funds for a KTV call focused on 'Environmental and Social Sustainability'. KTVs provide funding for projects to enable organisations which have not engaged with the OU before to partner with us to solve challenges they are facing, identify opportunities for further collaboration and develop lasting partnerships.

RES expect to fund approximately five projects (£5k- £10k) on 'Environmental and Social Sustainability'. Those that are aligned to at least one of the following UN Sustainable Development Goals (below) will be considered:

- Clean water and sanitation
- · Affordable and clean energy
- · Sustainable cities and communities
- Responsible consumption and production
- · Climate action
- · Life below water
- · Life on land
